Position Overview

To mentor and coach adult (age 18 - 60+ year old) participants in Loveland Ski Club alpine race programs in an enthusiastic and effective manner. This individual will be responsible for running the daily operations of the LSC Masters Ski program and will report directly to the Head Programs Director. The Masters coach will drive club growth and strive to retain existing members while working under the guidelines of the LSC mission statement and any other stated objectives. This coach will help the participants set and achieve goals in adult alpine skiing competitions and inspire the life-long enjoyment in sport.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

- Plan and execute weekly training plans for a variety of skill levels and be responsible for on-hill coaching duties.
- Set and maintain gated courses and closures following specifications of U.S. Ski & Snowboard and FIS.
- Able to provide and demonstrate proper U.S. Ski & Snowboard approved skiing technique and drill progressions
- Ability to analyze problems and resolve in a positive and timely manner
- Basic knowledge of Google Drive, Word processing, spreadsheets and browser applications; basic internet navigation and experience with online communication platforms
- Must have excellent phone and email communication skills with clientele and coworkers
- Must work well in a team environment
- Must be able to work in inclement weather in a high alpine environment
- Shoot video and conduct video analysis sessions with participants on a frequent basis.
- Participate in regular venue set-up, tear-down and maintenance as need throughout the season
- Participate in coaches meetings, briefings, and other professional functions as directed by the Head Program Director.

- High school graduation or GED is required.
- Advanced level skiing skills and ski racing knowledge is required.
- Alpine Level 100 Coach Certification through US Ski & Snowboard Coaches Education.
- Must have a ski racing background (in an organized US Ski & Snowboard, collegiate, or high school program; or have competition experience at the US Ski & Snowboard and/or FIS level).
- Experience in ski tuning, boot modification, and related equipment experience is desirable.
- Must have an understanding of current US Ski & Snowboard and FIS rules.
